DAY 1 Itinerary Overview

The City of Sails

Location: Auckland

Our North Island Future Leaders Tour begins in 'The City of Sails', upon the beautiful Waitemata Harbour in Auckland aboard an ocean-going maxi yacht. This world-renowned and picturesque seascape provides an exhilarating and unique environment in which students can actualise and their classroom leadership skills. With the direction of a skilled and highly experienced crew, students will learn the conduct, skills and safety procedures required to sail these magnificent vessels effectively.

Full participation and commitment is essential in order to achieve shared goals. Students are equally both challenged and empowered by the physical and mental requirements of being aboard the yacht, actualising the importance of leadership, communication, teamwork and respect.

DAY 2 Itinerary Overview

The City of Sails

Location: Auckland

After spending the night at anchor, students awake in the pristine maritime environment and enjoy the unique experience of breakfast aboard ship. Today the sailing experience becomes more specifically leadership orientated, with a range of activities designed around supporting and challenging participants on their leadership journey.

As well as onboard pursuits, a range of extra activities can be coordinated to enhance your desired curriculum outcomes. These include both water or land based team building and leadership objectives or physical education.

Docking in the late afternoon, students pack up their gear, carry out clean-up duties before a final debrief, and then disembarkation.

Volcanic Plateau

Location: Rotorua / Tongariro

Today sees students travelling south to the central volcanic plateau, stopping for lunch and a fascinating walk around the ancient Wai-O-Tapu Thermal Wonderland. Featuring bubbling mud pools, hot springs, collapsed craters and the famous Lady Knox Geyser, Wai-O-Tapu is a fascinating glimpse beneath the earth's crust.

After a remarkable afternoon, experiencing a unique geothermal environment, your journey continues toward the Tongariro National Park, via the magnificent Lake Taupo. Sited among the dramatic landscape of three imposing mountains, the world-renowned Leadership Centre will be your destination.

Leadership Building

DAY 6 Itinerary Overview

Glow Worm Exhilaration

Location: Waitomo / Auckland

After the inspirational experiences of previous days, the last installment of this incredible leadership journey sees students visit the iconic Waitomo Caves. This fascinating geological feature is one of New Zealand's most popular attractions and a highly enjoyable way in which to conclude the tour.

These amazing caves feature sparkling Glow Worms, glistening stalactites and stalagmites, awe-inspiring rock formations and bubbling underground rivers. For four magical hours, students will experience the thrill of abseiling down into the stunning Glow Worm cave, guided by instructors, and learn to negotiate the challenging terrain in a safe and fun manner. Hand/eye coordination and observation skills are improved and self confidence is enhanced, especially if fears are conquered and obstacles overcome.

After emerging from the caves, the students will return to Auckland by early evening, signalling the conclusion of the tour and a time for reflection on an epic and life-changing week.
